January is the season for New Year's resolutions. We have long been encouraged to use the start of a new year as a moment to take up intentions for improving our lives. Perhaps we try to lose some weight or reduce our screen time and read more books. Have you ever thought of a new year as a time to make intentions for your discipleship journey in the next year?

I have been encouraging our congregation since I began serving with you last year to make specific connections between church membership and discipleship. Disciples are those who follow Jesus in the way he set out for his followers to live. Membership is our public declaration of the church community in which we live and grow as disciples. We define the discipleship commitments of members at Salem as:

- 1) Worship in person or online every Sunday.
- 2) Pray 5 times a day—perhaps morning and evening and at meal times.
- 3) Grow in faith through intentional bible study or a devotional practice each year
- 4) Serve in and beyond the congregation in volunteer ministry according to your abilities.
- 5) Grow with intention toward giving a tithe of income to the congregation for the sake of its mission in Christ.
- 6) Share your faith 5 times a year by inviting others to worship or events in the life of the congregation

Our aim is to "provoke one another to love and good deeds" under grace, following Hebrews 10:24.

On January 11, Baptism of our Lord Sunday, worshippers will be invited to reflect on intentions they might want to attempt in any (or all) of these areas for the coming year. Each person's discipleship journey is unique. The steps Christ might be calling you toward will be different than anyone else's. But I believe that Jesus is always calling us onward. He continually called his first disciples to deeper faith and service, for it was through such devotion they would find the abundant life God has in store for us. I wish for you a Happy New Year. I pray for you a fruitful year of growing discipleship.

Old Business:

Continuing Resolution: What does membership mean? This would amend the constitution with the following: A25 Member are specifically encouraged to:

Worship in person or online every Sunday

Pray 5 times a day: Morning and evening and at mealtimes

Grow in their faith through intentional bible study or a devotional practice each year.

Service in and beyond the congregation in volunteer ministry

Grow with intention toward giving a tithe of their income to the congregation for the sake of its mission in Christ.

Share their faith 5 times a year by inviting others to worship or events in the life of the congregation.



The practices listed above are not to be used to determine a member's standing, but rather, are a vision of discipleship in which member mutually "provoke one another to love and good deeds" under grace, following Hebrew 10:24.

Action item for Council: To digest and add/change/delete the above language if needed. We will vote on this at the January 2026 council meeting.

Annual meeting – Jan. 25 (ASP meal) Feb 1 Snow date. If ASP cannot do the meal, we will plan a potluck.

Annual Meeting agenda/new council members: June 2023-May 2026: Jewel Basely (2nd Term), Sherri Nissen (1st Term) Sandi Sickels (2nd Term)

New Business:

January Benevolence: Brenna attached a spreadsheet to the monthly council agenda packet which shows the organizations our benevolence goes to monthly. Pastor/Sherri will also post this spreadsheet on our bulletin board. Sandi would like to provide benevolence to the Creston school district, specifically, the food program. Currently, there is a deficit of \$21,000 in the food program. As a council we began discussions about a plan or idea in which we can help long-term. Motion by Sherri Boschree to use January's benevolence towards the school district food deficit. Second by Linda Huffman, Council approved.

2026 budget – Time and Barb are working on the budget. The 2025 budget was hoping for 125k in contributions. We ended up with a deficit of 11k. This year we are on track for donation being over 130k. Expenses are estimated (year to date) under by 15k. For a full year, our budget will be 140k with about a 10k shortfall. We have a CD that will come due this month for 15k. At some point we will need to discuss raises for staff. Pastor – comfortable with current salary but we need to ensure we are covering cost of living expenses and increases.

Weather plan for services: The following is a proposed protocol for worship services during winter weather: The church will conduct worship services during winter weather if the following conditions are met: Our facilities are safely accessible, including the parking lot and sidewalks cleared of snow and ice for able bodied people to walk safely.

The pastor can get to Creston.

A qualified person to run the AV system and the YouTube Livestream and can safely get to worship.

An accompanist can safely get to worship.

Will post to the radio, Facebook and text the congregation if services are canceled.

Since we live stream our services on YouTube, it is valuable for the congregation to conduct a worship service even when conditions are imperfect, so that those who should not venture out can be encouraged to worship from home. Members should be strongly encouraged to place their safety first in determining whether to come to the church for worship during winter weather conditions. Note: A simple service of Scripture, Prayers, and Sermon without music can be conducted for the YouTube stream, even if accompanists cannot venture out.

Motion to adopt the above winter weather protocol by: Sherri Boschree with a second by Tim Kenyon.

Church Property: Fellowship hall air conditioning is complete; sanctuary and office air conditioning is still in progress. They continue to get prices for basement restrooms. Need to have Jerry check the front sliding doors, they do not close properly.

Outreach Ministry: We delivered 41 Christmas gifts to Creston Specialty Care and Accura for their residents on Dec. 14. Thank you to everyone for making this possible.

Worship & Music: Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Salem Oregon has given Salem Lutheran their complete set of handbells, handbell music and tables. Sheila will need to make a trip out to Oregon to pick up! Claudia Peppers purchased candles for the Advent Service, she is submitting a receipt for \$45.63 but does not want to be reimbursed for the cost. Sheila asked Tim/Barb if they would add it as “in-kind” monies towards Claudia’s giving to the church. Barb will get it recorded.

Memorial Committee:

Stewardship: Writing personal notes to giving families and will be part of the giving statement.

Endowment: Have tentative plans for a meeting in December and be a little more proactive for 2026.

Long Range Planning: Had to cancel last meeting due to the weather. Have a tentative new date of January 5, 2026, at 6:00 pm.

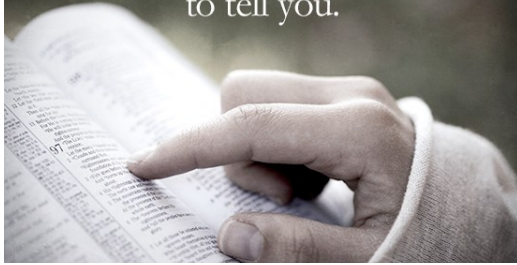
