



October 26 will be a special day. For me, it will be my 60th birthday. But for the church it will be Reformation Sunday. The Festival of the Reformation is a moment the traditions that came to follow the teaching of the reformers, especially Martin Luther, use to celebrate this great heritage. Reformation day itself is actually October 31 each year, the day before All Saints Day and, coincidentally, Halloween. Somehow, Martin Luther costumes have never taken off.

I think at certain times and places our Reformation celebrations get a little triumphalistic (sorry, I can't think of simpler word)—sort of "Woo Hoo! We're not Catholic." It can be a day when we trot out our best Luther hymns (A Mighty Fortress) and perhaps something from Johann Sebastian Bach from the choir. I hope we can remember that people who don't know our history may need some help understanding why we get so excited about a 16th century monk nailing a bunch of theological arguments to a church door in hopes of a good debate. Perhaps we ourselves even wonder—is all this still relevant? Is there still something important about the faith called "Lutheran?"

I'm certainly not one to think that Lutherans are better Christians than Catholics or Presbyterians or Baptists or Roman Catholics or United Methodists—especially United Methodists since I married one. We aren't better or even necessarily more theologically astute. But this tradition going back to Martin Luther's insight and experience is still a distinct witness to the gospel and one that is still an important voice in today's world. That witness can be summarized in one word—GRACE. Now I believe all Christians teach the grace and love of Jesus Christ, but Lutherans are grace radicals. Salvation is by grace ALONE. All of life, now and to eternity, is by the perfect gift of God. Lutherans push back on any notion that we somehow participate with God in our salvation by deciding for faith in Jesus or being a good person or doing good works. All that comes after God's decision for us, overcoming sin and death through the cross of Jesus Christ. Our life and service become a witness not to our faith but to God's great love.

One of the important implications of this today is our witness that all people need the gift of grace and, therefore, all people are equal in this way. Our culture understanding is moving evermore toward an assumption that some people are smart, wealthy, healthy, or powerful enough to not need grace. People quest to accumulate enough to live life on their own terms, with our without God. Reformation faith says this is not possible or true, and a way of life that leaves us enslaved to sin. Because, the Lutheran reformers taught, "We are justified by grace through faith apart from works of the Law," we are totally free for the love of neighbor and the love of God. That's something worth a good celebration.

And so, on October 26, once again we will celebrate the Reformation here at Salem. We will sing "A Mighty Fortress." There will be special music and Holy Communion. The color of the day will be red and you are invited to participate by wearing something red. And maybe there will be other things still to come. Won't you come and celebrate with us the radical grace of God?

Old Business:

Air conditioning updates: Bids have been received from Orr Plumbing and Heating for \$52,000, Troy Schroader \$\$37,000, and AJ Warner \$43,071.55. We are waiting on a bid from J & J Plumbing and Heating. Lenz and Holt did not submit bids. M/S/C by Sherri Boschee and Daniel Clausen to take the recommendation from the property committee once final bids are in and hold a special congregational meeting October 12 for voting with funds from the Endowment as needed.

Lutheran Lakeside presentation: this is a capital campaign asking for pledges to do upkeep and expansion of the site. Congregations can pledge annually and /or give as they choose. M/S/C by Thom Guzman and Sherri Boschee to give benevolence and a special offering 1 month for 3 years.

Building Use Agreement with Families First: Currently they are looking at Saturday's 11:00am-3:00pm per visit. Current dates scheduled are Sept. 27 and Oct. 11, with one month's notice of changes. Church activities will take precedence with Pastor working with them on scheduling. M/S/C by Pastor Jim and Sheila Clausen to move forward with this agreement.

Administrative Assistant Update: M/S/C by Thom Guzman and Sherri Boschee to accept the Executive committee's recommendation to offer the position to Brenna Peterson-Farnsworth on a 6-month trial period. Details to be arranged with Tim Kenyon and Randy Cook for hourly rate and increase after the trial period, as well as starting date, hours, training etc. to be worked out as well with the appropriate personnel.

New Business:

October Benevolence: M/S/C by Thom Guzman and Linda Huffman to give towards the McVann twins 1st Birthday wishes of Kids Care in Palestine. (Sandi will get Tim the information)

Giving from Pastor Jim's brother-in-law and spouse, Dave & Nichole Hoover, gift of \$3,000. M/S/C by Sherri Nissen and Sheila Clausen to receive the gift and to be earmarked for the proposed VBS format at \$1,500 year one and year two.

VBS proposal: Partner with the Presbyterian church to host Lutheran Lakeside students to present music and bible study. Hosting 4-6 students and providing meals July 6-9. This will be open to all and hosted at Salem Lutheran. M/S/C by Sherri Nissen and Sheila Clausen. (Note b and c got together per funding, details, etc.)

Basement Bathrooms: Orr has fixed the flush valve in the men's restroom at \$544. This has been an ongoing issue. The memorial committee has recommended use of funds to update both downstairs restrooms. With continued use this is needed as these are original fixtures, etc. M/S/C by Daniel Clausen and Jewel Baseley to have the property committee move forward.

Rally Sunday debriefing: the consensus is to have the committees that are in charge to ask for task groups to allow more involvement and not just a few doing the work. Also, to provide tables with chairs along with picnic tables.

CASA volunteers are needed in the county. Information will be put in the newsletter. Sherri will call and discuss the possibility of a local person doing a temple talk.

Outdoor sound system: Tim talked with Reiman's, it will cost between \$60-\$250 to fix the switches and will need to be sent to Des Moines for 4-6 weeks. M/S/C unanimous to repair it.

Livestream recordings: Jerry Nissen is working with Reiman's to troubleshoot why they are garbled and hard to hear.

Blessing of the Pets service for September 28 is postponed currently. Possible rescheduled in the spring with Blessing of the Gardens service.

Committee Reports: Christian Education: Rally Sunday Sept. 7

Church Property: Looking at air conditioning bids, will begin updating the downstairs restrooms, and will need to get dirt for the yard to fill low spots.




